- The OpenChain Specification 2.0 is now in “bug-fix” mode ahead of April release.
- Our new “responsive” Conformance Web App is live in English and Japanese
- We had a great workshop in China on the 22nd March and will continue with a Chinese Work Group moving forward.
- We have released the OpenChain Specification 1.2 in Simplified Chinese.
- We have had various sub-group meetings in Japan, with the automotive group kicking off on the 28th of March.
- We have released the Open Source Policy Template in Japanese.

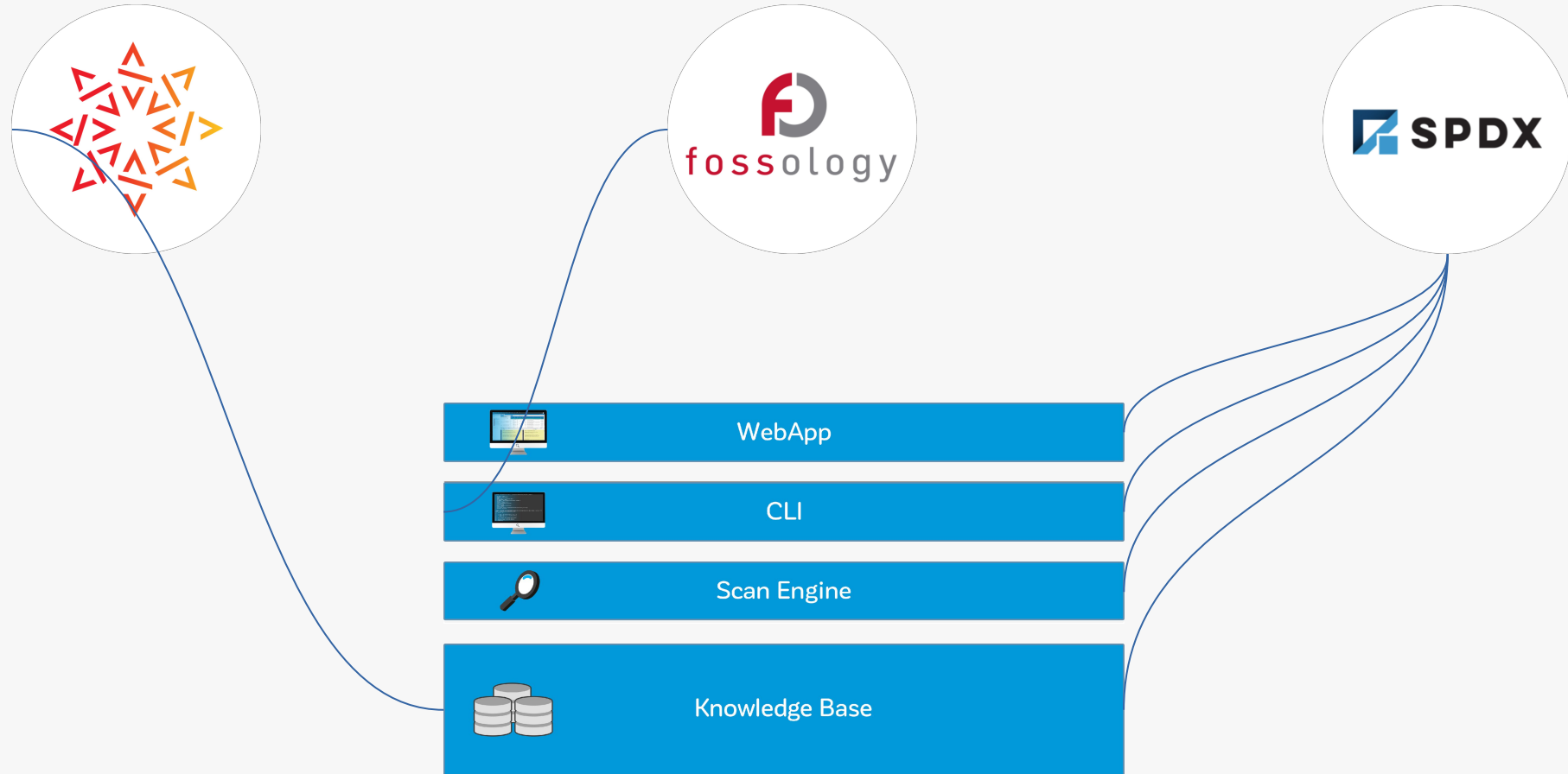
